

## Progress of Coptic studies at Claremont Graduate University (CGU)

We are truly thankful to God who continues to grant us progress in Coptic studies at CGU in the following areas ([hyperlinks are shown in blue/purple](#)):

**1) The 11<sup>th</sup> International Congress of Coptic Studies** was hosted by CGU, 25-30 July 2016, and organized by St Shenouda the Archimandrite Coptic Society. The Congress was very successful. **2) Coptic Studies Track:** [Professor Gawdat Gabra](#), [other faculty](#), [Coptic Studies Council](#), [Courses](#), [Student Profiles](#), and [Recognition](#).

**3) Developing career Coptologists:** Several MA/PhD candidates at CGU are writing their dissertations on Coptic topics, supervised by the eminent Coptologist Professor Gawdat Gabra and other faculty. Copts and non-Copts continue to enroll and graduate under the Coptic Studies Track (or transdisciplinary tracks including Coptic studies). **4) Courses in Coptic Studies:** Since 2007, Professor Gabra has been teaching courses on Coptic Art and Archeology, Coptic Monasticism, Coptic New Testament and Liturgy, Coptic Sayings of the Desert Fathers and Mothers, Coptic Hagiography, Egypt's Religious Heritage, and Coptic Literature. **5) The Claremont Coptic Encyclopedia (CCE):** All eight volumes of *The Coptic Encyclopedia* (Aziz Atiya, Macmillan, 1991) have been posted according to the Library of Congress standards. The world has been waiting for it: there are about 15-65K views per month. Ongoing tasks: continuously adding new topics and images and updating old entries.

**6) In honor of Professor Gawdat Gabra,** two celebration books (festschrifts) were recently published by two international groups of Coptology scholars:

i) M. Eaton-Krauss, C. Fluck, and G.J.M. van Loon, Eds., *Egypt 1350 BC – AD 1800: Art Historical and Archaeological Studies for Gawdat Gabra* (Reichert, 2011).

ii) Y.N. Youssef and S. Moawad, Eds., *From Old Cairo to the New World: Coptic Studies Presented to Gawdat Gabra on the Occasion of His Sixty-Fifth Birthday* (Peeters, 2013).

It is rare for any professor to receive this honor once, let alone twice. It is also a testimony to the scope and influence of Professor Gabra as an advisor to students and scholars of Coptic Studies (especially in art, literature, history, and architecture).

**7) Students regularly present the results of their research** at the American Academy of Religion, Society of Biblical Studies, and [St. Shenouda – UCLA Conferences](#). Also read their views on the [future of Coptology](#) and on [Coptic studies](#).

**8) Public Lecture Series** continues to present topics of Coptic studies to faculty, students, Claremont residents, and the Coptic community.

**10) [Academic Tour of Coptic Egypt](#):** Prof. Gawdat Gabra led faculty and students in tours of Coptic Egypt in January 2008, 2009 and 2010. The tours were very successful and the group was interviewed by Aghapy TV and CTV. **11) [NEH Grant](#):** Thanks to efforts by faculty and administration at CGU, the National Endowment for Humanities has allocated an endowment of \$50,000 to Coptic studies at CGU. Though we can only spend from its annual revenue, it is a significant recognition and a step toward a Coptic studies chair. Grant applications to NEH and corporate foundations are always on the agenda.

In keeping with its mission to support Coptic Studies, St Shenouda Society pledged to CGU \$26000 annually in support of Coptic Studies Track, payable in two installments: 30 June and 31 December.
